Getting to the Museum

Accessible drop-off areas are located on 12th Avenue (Hamilton Building) or 14th Avenue (North Building). There are a few accessible parking spaces on 13th Avenue and some on Level 2 of the Cultural Center Garage (enter garage from 12th Avenue and follow signs to northwest corner elevators).

Know Before you go: Museum Facilities and Policies

There are companion care/family restrooms and free lockers for storing large bags on Level 1 of both buildings.

If you must end your visit early due to a medical emergency or another legitimate reason, you may request a "rain check" ticket from a guest services representative at the welcome desk in either building.

Food and beverage are only allowed in designated areas of the museum. These areas include: the Lower Level education space in the North Building, Reiman Bridge connecting the two buildings, at the tables near the North Building welcome desk, and in the Duncan Family Pavilion.

Please note: The museum allows service animals. As defined by the 2010 ADA regulations, a service animal is any dog trained to do work or perform tasks for an individual with a disability.



For Visitors with Mobility Disabilities

All public areas of the museum are wheelchair accessible. Motorized wheelchairs are welcome.

The main entrances to both buildings are equipped with power assist doors. Accessible restrooms are available on every level of the Hamilton Building, and on Level 1 of the North Building. A single user/family restroom is available on Level 1 of both buildings. Wheelchairs are available free of charge on a first-come, first-served basis at the welcome center in either building.



For Visitors Who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing

Sign language interpretation can be scheduled for any museum tour, program, or event with two weeks' notice. Shorter notice requests accommodated if possible. Audio tour transcripts will be provided for any exhibition with an audio tour. To make arrangements, email access@denverartmuseum.org or call 720-913-0074. VRS calls accepted.



For Visitors Who are Blind or Have Low Vision

The DAM offers regularly scheduled tactile tables on a bimonthly basis. These tactile tables offer multisensory, hands-on art experiences based on objects in the galleries and are facilitated by specially trained docents. They are a drop-in format, free with admission, no reservations required.

We also offer tactile tours featuring touchable materials and description; please request two weeks in advance by calling 720-913-0074 or e-mailing access@denverartmuseum.org. Free with admission.

Exhibitions in the Anschutz Gallery, Martin and McCormick Gallery, and Gallagher Family Gallery will have large-print label copy booklets and braille label copy booklets available for complimentary use in the exhibition.

For Visitors with Early Stage Alzheimer's and Dementia

Art & About Tours are designed for visitors with early-stage Alzheimer's or dementia and their care partners. Experience and discuss art together on a tour led by a specially trained guide.
